"The Gathering of the Legends" photography exhibition

Alexandria, VA (June 17, 2010) - Meet Alexandria's Living Legends of 2009-2010. Del Ray Artisans presents "The Gathering of the Legends" photo exhibition at its Nicholas A. Colasanto Center gallery, 2704 Mount Vernon Avenue, from August 6 – 22. The exhibition is the culmination of this year's Living Legends of Alexandria program that features 30 of Alexandria's recent history makers, many of whom will be in attendance at the opening reception on Friday, August 6, 7-10 p.m. Twelve individuals or teams were selected from among the nominees as the 2009-2010 Living Legends of Alexandria – Chet Avery, Rosalind Bovey, V. Rodger Digilio, Nelson A. Green, Sr., Alice Merrill and Linda Odell, T. Michael Miller, John Porter, Joan and John Renner, David G. Speck, Pat Troy, Lois Walker, and Betty R. Wright. Their stories and photographs have appeared in the local press including the Alexandria Gazette Packet, localKicks and AlexandriaNews.org. and will be published in a catalog available at the opening reception. An Artist's Talk on the theme of the Art of Photojournalism is scheduled for Thursday, August 12, 7-8:30 p.m.

The project was conceived in the fall of 2006 by artist-photographer Nina Tisara in response to requests for photographs of people who were no longer living. When the photos were not available in the Tisara Photography archives, she devised a system for creating the photos and the accompanying stories.

Past Legends have included educators, artists, arts advocates, clergy, business people, lawyers, and community activists. Legends have created theater companies, computer training programs for low income citizens, a boat building school for at-risk youth, programs to stop child abuse and to improve community health, the Torpedo Factory Art Center, the Freedman's Contraband Cemetery and more. They have worked to build community by remembering African American heritage and the Holocaust. They have worked to increase racial and cultural dialog. The photographs and documentary materials are donated to the Special Collections Department of Alexandria Library where they are archived and available for future research.
